The Sweden Farmers Museum was established in 2005 to preserve the town’s agricultural history; to educate adults and children through a variety of interactive activities; and to celebrate, at the community level, the successes and importance of local farming. The museum is located in a circa 1820s farmhouse on the crest of the Niagara Escarpment at the entrance to Lakeview Cemetery. The town is currently in the process of restoring the farmhouse to its original condition. Many agricultural artifacts have already been donated to the museum and will soon be on display.

On Saturday, September 22, community residents were invited to the Harvest Festival and 5K run to benefit the museum. Besides museum tours and wagon rides through the cemetery with historical commentary, the event included rug hooking and log cutting demonstrations, a tractor show featuring vehicles of all proportions and arts, crafts and food.
